
Directions to Venue

From the South Take the A1 north bound under the M62 past Ferrybridge Power Station to the next junction A63. Take the junction off and follow the A63 to Selby, follow road for approx. 6 miles going over the first roundabout to the next one. Turn left in to Thorpe Willoughby. Venue is on the right with a large car park behind building. To enter car park go past the venue and turn right at the Public House and first right again into car park.

From the North: Take the A1 south bound keeping to the left at M1 junction to A63 junction. Take the junction off and follow the A63 to Selby, follow road for approx. 6 miles going over the first roundabout to the next one. Turn left into Thorpe Willoughby. Venue is on the right with a large car park behind building. To enter car park go past the venue and turn right at the Public House.

* SPECIAL AWARD CLASSES *

As a club we are aware of the lack of Classes at many Open Shows, which in turn hinders many of our judges to reach the required amount of 'hands on' experience of Cavaliers to enable them to progress through our judging lists. We have liaised with the Kennel Club and decided to offer 'Special Awards Classes' at our Open Shows, where hopefully there is already a good entry for the Open Show itself and many of these exhibitors will also support this idea, giving the invited judge for the Special Award classes a nice entry to go over and therefore enabling them to include these on their C.V. for progression through the lists.

N.B. These Special Awards are judged as an entirely separate entity from the show and will be judged during the lunch time period. A dog beaten in competition for a Special Award is not considered to be a beaten dog for the purposes of Regulations F(1)26 and 27. (Best Puppy in Show and Best in Show)

The Special Award classes are entirely arranged as a method of promoting B or C list judges. All dogs entered into these classes must also be entered into the main show classes.

- 17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
- Not for competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
- 19. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.
- 20. The Officers and Committee of the Society can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by stallholders at the show and remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale at the show may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- FIRE EXITS: Please note their location and Keep Clear at all times. Cages MUST NOT be places in front of fire exits so as to obstruct the exit.
- 22. EXERCISE AREA: This will be clearly indicated. Please remember it is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to clear up any 'mistakes'. There will be equipment provided. Please use it.
- CAGES: Cages, Grooming Tables and Trolleys must not obstruct the gangways and are NOT ALLOWED AT THE RINGSIDE.
- Any expense incurred by the Society from dishonoured cheques will be passed on to the Exhibitor concerned.
- MOBILE TELEPHONES: All mobile telephones must be turned off and not be used within the environs of the show.

SECURITY AT SHOWS

In light of recent events the Kennel Club would like to issue a reminder to all societies of the importance of security at dog shows. The Kennel Club understand that due to the nature of dog shows and the quantity of paraphernalia exhibitors bring, it would be extremely difficult for show organisers to take on the issue of security alone, therefore we would re-iterated the advice being given by the Police and security services, that everyone in the UK should remain vigilant and this applies to those organising and taking part in dog shows.

The importance of exhibitors feeling that they and their dogs are safe when attending a show cannot be underestimated. We would therefore remind you of the importance of the need for show organisers and exhibitors to remain mindful of potential dangers and that all visitors to shows generally need to be vigilant and alert. Furthermore the society provide robust notification informing exhibitors of where to report to should they see anything suspicious or of concern, and the evacuation procedures in place.

In view of the above, should you see anything suspicious or of concern, please alert the Show Manager, and/or the Show Secretary immediately. If it is a package or bag you are concerned about, please do NOT attempt to move it or examine it yourself.

Should it be necessary for the hall to be evacuated, please remember that evacuation should be carried out as speedily but as safely carried out as possible, as in the case of a fire. It is important that you do not block the exit routes with cages or bags. Please follow any instructions given to you by the Show Management regarding evacuation procedures.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- The show will open at 10.00 a.m.
- Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that dogs are available for judging when required.
- 3. Judging will commence at 10.30 a.m.
- Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will
 close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5. **ENTRY FEES**: Non -members 1st Entry £5.00 subsequent entries £2.00 with same dog. Members & Associated Members 1st Entry £4.00 subsequent entries with the same dog £1.50: Junior Handling classes 50p. Not for Competition £1.00 per dog. Catalogues £2.50 (pre-paid) £3.00 on day of show (Limited number available)
- 6. There will be no prize money.
- 7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.
- 10. <u>Best Puppy in Show</u> Where a Best puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A Puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.
- 11. <u>Best in Show</u> Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex but only if they have received a first prize in a class at the same show. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
- 2. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with permission of the Show Management.
- 13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 16. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licenced events.

When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.

If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all. The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.

Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog. When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.

Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.

Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

(The word DOG includes both sexes)

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e.: Saturday 21st December, 2019. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

(1) WITHDRAWAL: The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation

(2) **TRANSFER:** a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex. weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

b) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively the show secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class, or Yearling Class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid

Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where challenge certificates

were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club

Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for

the breed

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at

VETERAN For all dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the Show. SPECIAL POST GRADUATE SPECIAL VINTAGE Similar to Post Graduate Class except that it is restricted to colour. For dogs of not less than ten years of age on the first day of the show.

For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor,

each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace or Team. Not for competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must

be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club Registered.

SPECIAL AWARD CLASSES For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at DOG OR BITCH

the show.
